**Rempstone Wildlife Campaign 2021.** Last week we introduced our 2021 wildlife campaign, and asked for your ideas. So far you've suggested:

- A Village Wildlife Survey (not just birds).
- Making Hedgehog houses, Nesting boxes, and Bee hotels.
- A Sunflower competition.
- Bulb planting (this will have to wait for later in the year)
- Planting wildflowers, and allowing a section of your garden to go wild.
- A pet photograph competition.

What other ideas do you have? We will put them together, and create a programme for the year.



From 29<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> January the RSPB is holding its annual garden birdwatch. This is a national survey of birds across the UK, and is based on what each of us can see in our gardens. **Coronavirus Vaccinations.** An increasing number of village residents have received their invitations to get vaccinated. It can take a while to get through by telephone. We have found that the easiest way is online. You can do this yourself, or ask a friend to help you. All the information you need is on the letter you receive from the NHS. When you book, they will give you the dates and times for both your first and your second vaccination. It is also possible to add family members who can then be vaccinated at the same time. There is a choice of locations. The nearest is currently Gamston Community Hall.

If you have difficulty accepting the invitation, or don't have transport to get the vaccination site, then please ask a member of the Working Party for help.

When you arrive for your vaccination it speeds things up if you have with you your NHS letter plus following information:
